Celebrating Canada's 150th

This year, Canada Day celebrations will be extraspecial! To mark the 150th anniversary of Canada's Confederation, events and activities will be happening throughout the Quinte region.



In Quinte West, the week leading up to Canada Day will be considered "Multicultural Week", with different events scheduled for each day. Details are still being set, but proposed activities include: an Indigenous art festival, a Francophone concert series, an Oktoberfest celebration, a Celtic picnic, and a Mediterranean food festival. Events will begin June 25th, and will culminate in a Canada Day bash on July 1st!

In Belleville, festivities will also be beginning earlier than usual to commemorate this exciting anniversary. June 29th will offer families a chance to see a movie under the stars at the new Zwick's Park main stage. On June 30th, Juno Award-winning Canadian band Trooper will play a free concert, also at Zwick's. July 1st will offer lots of activities throughout the park, including: face painting, bounce houses, petting zoo, a beach volley-ball tournament, and more! As always, activities will conclude with the annual fireworks show.

The Board (pictured above) consists of health care professionals, auditors, accountants, teachers, administrators, private sector business people, members with expertise in family counselling, emergency response, accessibility, transit systems and much more. Diversity is what makes us effective and strong.

The Board is responsible for oversight of QUIS in all aspects, including the vision and mission, overall financial condition, and strategic planning. The Executive Director (ED) is responsible for operations and is responsible to the Board of Directors. The Board and the ED operate in a very communicative and collaborative relationship, and every month the ED attends Board meetings. Farmers Feed the World Skills Connect Event

On April 12th, 2017, QUIS held a Skills Connect Employment Event as part of the Farmers Feed the World (FFTW) program. The event took place in the Multipurpose Room of the Belleville Sports & Wellness Centre from 9am to 3pm.

The event was created to introduce Syrian refugees to local employers, primarily in the agricultural and agri-food sector. The Quinte region has a large rural area, with farming making up a sizeable portion of the local economy.

At the event, the newcomers were able to present their prior work skills, and be matched with suitable local employers. There were over 8 employers present throughout the day, with 2 local employment agencies also present to offer their resume-building and job-finding services.

Refugees came from far and wide to participate in the event, with buses bringing attendees from Hamilton, Mississauga, Toronto, Milton, Oakville, Kingston, and more!





The participating employers were: Norman Hardie Winery, Highline Mushrooms, Hillier Creek Estates & Winery, Carpet One, Picnic in the County, Vantage Foods, PEC Career Edge, Adecco, Haanover View Farms, as well as Meta Employment Services and Community Employment Services.

Many newcomers have already been in contact with employers, and the event has created solid connections and networking opportunities for these individuals and employers alike.

QUIS hopes that this event is a good indication for the future of Syrian newcomers, as well as the Quinte region!
