

CANADA DAY



CANADA DAY **CELEBRATION JULY 1, 2014**

Tuesday, July 1, 2014 is a civic holiday marking the 147th anniversary of Canada becoming a country. Canada Day, known as Dominion Day before 1982, marks the passing of British North America Act (BNA). In 1867, the BNA joined Upper (Ontario) and Lower (Quebec) Canada with New Brunswick and Nova Scotia to become the first four provinces in the Dominion of Canada.

Local notables:

While neighbouring Kingston would be home to Canada's first Prime Minister, Sir John A. MacDonald (1878-1891), Belleville resident Sir Mackenzie Bowell would serve as the 5th Prime Minister of Canada. Bowell, who emigrated from England in 1832, was a local printer who began his career as an apprentice at the Belleville Intelligencer newspaper. He went on to serve as Prime Minister between 1894 and 1896. He continued to serve as a Senator until his death in 1917, just prior to his 94th birthday, when he was buried in the Belleville Cemetery.


NEWCOMER EMPLOYMENT RESEARCH PROJECT

Quinte Immigration Services has completed building and updating databases that will give us a better picture of newcomer employment in the Quinte area and will help to match qualified candidates local with employers in the future.

Executive Director of QUIS, Orlando Ferro, hired three researchers, Jeff Wildgen, Julie Tang, and Tamara Malinski, for a six month project (from December 2013 to June 2014). They were tasked with updating the QUIS client database with new information about QUIS clients' work lives. Clients were asked to fill out an online survey and answer questions about their work experience, skills, qualifications, training, and education. With this information, QUIS can better represent its clients to employers, industry associations, and municipal agencies that deal with economic development.

Many of the questions from the online survey have been added to the new QUIS registration form to ensure that all clients of QUIS have an equal opportunity to join in the local workforce.

In addition, the research team compiled data about the local businesses in the Quinte area, collecting contact details and descriptions of each business. This information will be useful in
